MANY STUMBLE AND FALL AND NEVER DO THE FOURTH STEP AT ALL. Four and Five are attached at the hip as I have never experience anyone completing a Fourth Step and refused to uncork the pent up sour vintage no matter how sharp the screw. Should thorough rob timely? We launched into a vigorous

course of action.

If it looks like your sponsee has Fourth Stepitus this format is suggested to keep them into action. This is suggested for the newcomer to get them through the Steps and to a spiritual experience as quickly and as thoroughly as possible. For the chronic relapse the need to be more thorough, use the suggested outline found in the Big Book of A.A. as this may be more appropriate for them. Each sponsee is different, be prayerful and always consult with your spon-



- 1. Get a pencil
- 2. Get a legal pad
- 3. The name of the person or institution that the resentment is held
- 4. The date
- 5. The incident

EASY BREEZY

The A.A. Big Book says that it needs to be written. Keep it brief, no more information than can be written on one side of a legal pad.

NO REASON TO BE FEARFUL, YOUR SPONSOR IS THERE TO HELP LIFT THE SPIRITUAL

The format for the Fourth Step as outlined in the Big Book comes into play with you and your sponsee together working the Fifth Step.

- 1. The cause
- How it effects my: Sex relation, Self esteem (fear) Security ,Personal relations
- 3. What was my part?
- 4. Fear inventory
- Sex inventory
- Character defects
- 7. The Seven Deadly Sins (behaviors that block us from spiritual growth)
- 8. Positive character attributes

THE SEVEN DEADLY SINS (CHARACTER FLAWS)

Pride is excessive belief in one's own abilities that interferes with the individual's recognition of the grace of God. It has been called the sin from which all others arise. Pride is also known as Vanity. **Envy** is the desire for others' traits, status, abilities, or situation. **Gluttony** is an inordinate desire to consume more than that which one requires.

Lust is an inordinate craving for the pleasures of the body.

Anger is manifested in the individual who spurns love and opts instead for fury. It is also known as Wrath.

Greed is the desire for material wealth or gain, ignoring the realm of the spiritual. It is also called Avarice or Covetousness.

Sloth is the avoidance of physical or spiritual work

I have used this format and found it very productive and immensely valuable. It gets the sponsee through Step Four and Step Five in a timely manner. They can always go back and do another

Fourth Step if they feel it may be necessary after they have had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps. I asked my sponsor and he told me that he had a sponsee that did a one sentence Fourth Step and had been sober for Thirty years. (He refused to tell what that sentence was)

Greg from Austin writes:

"On my 90th day of sobriety I went to workshop on the 12 steps. During the workshop we went through the steps with a partner. It was very fast and done with the idea that we would not linger too long on each step, more get an understanding of each step and gain some kind of experience with it. It made me think of Dr. Bob and how he worked people through the steps quickly. During this process I did an abbreviated 4th and 5th step with another alcoholic. I was amazed. I was able to get relief from some things that I had been carrying around since my early childhood. I felt great."

A Letter From Bill Wilson On The Use Of The Lord's Prayer At A.A. Meetings - April 14, 1959

Dear Russ,

Am right sorry for my delay in answering. Lois and I were a long time out of the country and this was followed by an attack of the marathon type of flu that has been around here in New York. We are okay now, however, but I did want to explain my delay. Now about the business of adding the Lord's Prayer to each A.A. meeting. This practice probably came from the Oxford Groups who were influential in the early days of A.A. You have probably noted in AA. Comes of Age what the connection of these people in A.A. really was. I think saying the Lord's Prayer was a custom of theirs following the close of each meeting. Therefore it quite easily got shifted into a general custom among us. Of course there will always be those who seem to be offended by the introduction of any prayer whatever into an ordinary A.A. gathering. Also, it is sometimes complained that Devotedly yours, Bill Wilson the Lord's Prayer is a Christian document. Nevertheless this Prayer is of such widespread use and

recognition that the arguments of its Christian origin seems to be a little farfetched. It is also true that most A.A.s believe in some kind of God and that communication and strength is obtainable through His grace. Since this is the general consensus it seems only right that at least the Serenity Prayer and the Lord's Prayer be used in connection with our meetings. It does not seem necessary to defer to the feelings of our agnostic and atheist newcomers to the extent of completely hiding our light under a bushel. However, around here, the leader of the meeting usually asks those to join him in the Lord's Prayer who feel that they would care to do so. The worst that happens to the objectors is that they have to listen to it. This is doubtless a salutary exercise in tolerance at their stage of progress. So that's the sum of the Lord's Prayer business as I recall it. Your letter made me wonder in just what connection you raise the question. Meanwhile, please know just how much Lois and I treasure the friendship of you both. May Providence let our paths presently cross one of these days.

1944 — New York Intergroup was established.

March 11

1949 — The Calix Society, an association of Roman Catholic alcoholics who are maintaining their sobriety through participation in Alcoholics Anonymous, was formed in Minneapolis by five Catholic AA members.

March 15

March 16

1940 — Alcoholic Foundation and Works Publishing moved from Newark to 30 Vesey St. in lower Manhattan.

March 21

1881 — Dr. Bob's wife, Anne, was born.

1966 — Ebby T., whom Bill W. called his sponsor, died sober.

March 22

1951 — William Duncan Silkworth, MD, died at Towns Hospital. He helped more than 40,000 alcoholics during his lifetime. 1984 — Clarence S., "Home Brewmeister," died at 81

I would like to take a few moments of your time to thank all the members and member groups of the Southern Maryland Intergroup Association for the opportunity to serve as your Chair for the past three years.

When I began this journey in April 2020, we were amid the COVID-19 Pandemic. Almost all our member groups had suspended their meetings, and we were navigating a relatively new concept for holding meetings; on-line through Zoom, Google Meet, and other forums.

We met those challenges, and by June 2020, meetings began to reopen under limited and specific circumstances. Also, and because of the issues we faced due to COVID, both the Phone and Bookstall Chair positions were vacated for a short while, but by January of 2021, both were filled by Melissa W., (Phone) and

flawlessly.

Unfortunately, we lost several meetings during the pandemic, 25 in total. Additionally, the 2020 Serenity Breakfast, Picnic, and Gratitude Dinner all had to be cancelled. These were disheartening times, but day by day, we trudged through the worst of it and things started to look the Treasurer and Janine G. agreed to extend her term as the Vice-Chair. Meetings were rapidly reopening, and by the Summer of 2021, 102 meetings had reopened. We opened a new On-Line Bookstall and released a mobile app for the Android platform. We held the Serenity Breakfast later than usual in 2021, and we were also able to hold the Gratitude Dinner in November 2021.

By Spring 2022, we elected a new Vice-Chair (Katherine L.), a new Treasurer (Rebecca B.) and a new Parliamentarian (Rob A.). We extended the Chair and Secretary positions for one additional year to maintain a consistent rotation. Additionally, nearly all of our groups were Buddy F., (Bookstall) who have performed meeting in person, the Serenity Breakfast

was held on-schedule, and we had released a new printed Where and When for the first time in almost two years. Melissa had introduced and implemented a new phone service that saved thousands of dollars and insured that callers were directed to the best available person. We were also successful in consolidating the up! Cora W. agreed to extend her term as SMIA and District 1 Meeting Guide feeds, which ensured that our meeting information was accurate.

> As we completed 2022, and moved into 2023, most everything the SMIA does to support our member groups had returned to normal. While we did have our fair share of challenges, it was a genuine blessing to serve as your Chair. I cannot overstate the support I received from the other Board members and Committee Chairs. It was phenomenal.

I will continue to serve as your webmaster for as long as you need me, and I'll also be serving as your Bookstall Chair for the foreseeable future. So again, I'd like to express my sincere gratitude for the opportunity to serve as your Chair. God Bless you all. Bill L.

The origins of Alcoholics Anonymous can be traced to the Oxford Group, a religious movement popular in the United States and Europe in the early 20th century. Members of the Oxford Group practiced a formula of selfimprovement by performing selfinventory, admitting wrongs, making amends, using prayer and meditation, and carrying the message to others.

In the early 1930s, a well-to-do Rhode Islander, Rowland H., visited the noted Swiss psychoanalyst Carl Jung for help with his alcoholism. Jung determined that Rowland's case was medically hopeless, and that he could only find relief through a vital spiritual experience. Jung directed him to the Oxford Group.

ORIGINS

Rowland later introduced fellow Vermonter Edwin ("Ebby") T. to the group, and the two men along with several others were finally able to keep from drinking by practicing the Oxford Group principles.

One of Ebby's schoolmate friends from Vermont, and a drinking buddy, was Bill W. Ebby sought out his old friend at his home at 182 Clinton Street in Brooklyn, New York, to carry the message of hope.

Bill W. had been a golden boy on Wall Street, enjoying success and power as a stockbroker, but his promising career had been ruined by continuous and chronic

alcoholism. Now, approaching 39 years of age, he was learning that his problem was hopeless, progressive, and irreversible. He had sought medical treatment at Towns Hospital in Manhattan, but he was still drinking.

Bill was, at first, unconvinced by Ebby's story of transformation and the claims of the Oxford Group. But in December 1934, after again landing in Towns hospital for treatment, Bill underwent a powerful spiritual experience unlike any he had ever known. His depression and despair were lifted, and he felt free and at peace. Bill stopped drinking, and worked the rest of his life to bring that freedom and peace to other alcoholics. The roots of Alcoholics Anonymous were planted.


